Dear Parents,

During this term, the children will be working on the related themes of **Animals**, **New Life and Growth.** As part of this work, the children will have the opportunity to observe and handle **ducks**, which we will keep in incubators in the nursery. The Play House

During this term the children will have the opportunity to work with "**The Play House**" **Theatre Company** which is a participatory theatre-in-education programme, for Nursery aged children from **Language Alive!** The children will work collaboratively with one another and the artists in a multi-sensory environment. We have booked the "**Play House**" Theatre company for the children this week on **Thursday 13th and Friday 14th May** to perform **By the Riverside** and on **Thursday 1st and Friday 2nd July** they will be returning again to perform **The Little Red Hen.** The cost of these events will be met entirely from the school budget.

Resource Bags

Throughout this year we have provided activities for all our families through Tapestry and by sending home resource bags to support children's learning at home. The children will be receiving their next activity bag which supports healthy eating through cooking activities with recipes and ingredients included. We are very grateful for the support from, Asda Queslett, Tesco on Aston Lane and Witton Lodge Community Association with the delivery of this project.
